Another part of our anti-bullying education is understanding that each of us plays a role when unexpected behaviour happens in our school. We also learn that we each have a responsibility to each other to ensure that learning can take place in a safe and happy environment.

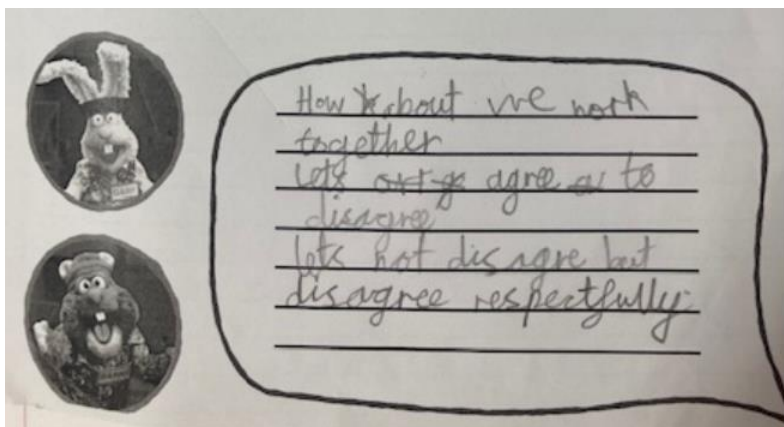
It is important that we learn what to do when we see unexpected behaviour happening and how we can support children who are feeling targeted, worried and anxious.

We provide children with the language that they need to resolve conflict and help them understand that disagreement does not always need to lead to conflict.

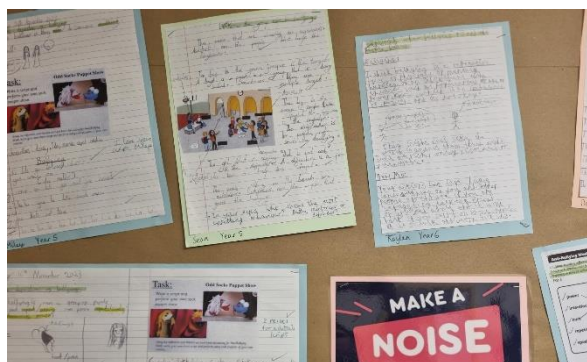

We do, however, take bullying incredibly seriously and devote a lot of time within our RSHE curriculum to teaching children about relationships with each other. It is also really important that children come to tell us when unexpected behaviour is happening so we can support children in school as soon as possible. We have posters around school to support children (and adults) in knowing who to speak to when they are worried or concerned.

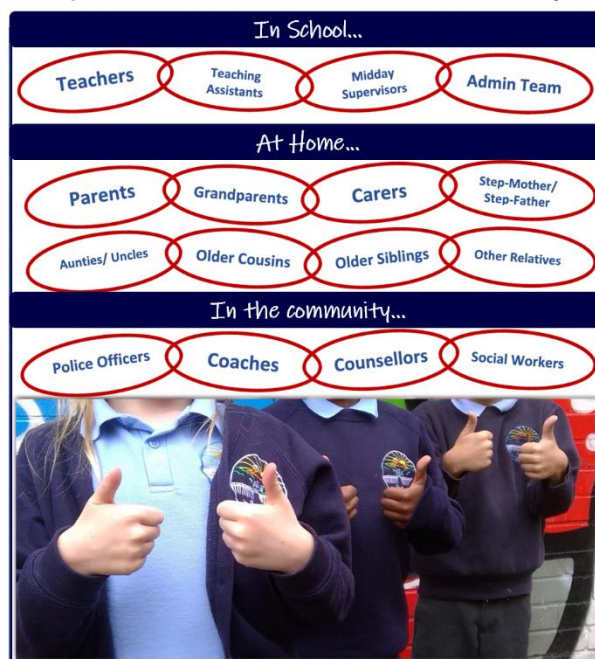
