E SAFETY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Online Safety is outline in the policy and also in the behaviour and anti-bullying policies. ICT equipment in school is subject to filters, led by Atom IT- these are in place and monitored. Any updates are applied when identified to prevent access to extremism material All equipment is supplied via Atom IT and are in line with regulations Children are taught to be safe online through the PSHE, SMSC and RSHE curriculum. Teachers speak to the children regularly about staying safe online, concerns are then communicated to parents 	Green
