Dear families,

Having been fortunate enough to work as the Head Teacher at Phoenix Infant and Nursery School since April 2012, it is a huge privilege to write to you to as the Interim Executive Head Teacher at Priory Junior School. I am absolutely delighted to be given this opportunity and this week it has been a real pleasure to start this journey. I have been overwhelmed by the positive welcome from the community.

I am excited to be working closely with you, our outstanding staff team and governors and most importantly our children to build on the school's many achievements to date. The recent OFSTED report from May 2023 highlighted was very positive 50222247 (ofsted.gov.uk) and acknowledged that 'Priory Junior School is an inclusive and happy school. Leaders have high expectations of all pupils. The school's PRIDE (peace, respect, independence, determination and equality) values help pupils to meet these expectations. Pupils understand these values. They say they help them to behave and learn well. Pupils enjoy getting rewards for demonstrating these values. The school is calm and orderly. Pupils are polite and well mannered. Pupils say that teachers are fair and kind. They say that they enjoy their lessons because teachers make them interesting.' I have certainly experienced that this week and the way children have returned or started at Priory has been exceptional! Our continued aim is to ensure that every child at Priory Junior School enjoys coming to school, is motivated and inspired by the highest quality provision which meets every child's individual, social, emotional and academic needs.

I am keen on further developing our whole school community which thrives on mutual respect and values positive relationships. I know how vital working in partnership with parents really is in order for children to find school a positive and rewarding experience. As key educators in your children's lives, I feel that it is important that you have a voice and that as a school we are approachable and allocate time to listen to your worries or thoughts. As a result of this I have listened to a wide range of feedback from different

sources, and we are introducing some new routines and systems over the coming months to support this. This includes;

- Children in Year 3 and 4 coming onto the playground in the morning. This further supports the transition from Infant to Junior School and enables new families to get to know the staff.
- Parents evenings will take place in the classrooms for a more personal meeting and this also gives families the opportunities to see the classrooms.
- Key diary dates being shared with families (see below) There will be other dates added during the year, but we have endeavoured to get the key dates in.
- Methods of communication are being reviewed and streamlined over the term.

Many thanks for the positive feedback received so far - we really appreciate it. We are monitoring the drop off and pickups and will refine this over the coming weeks. When collecting your child from Year 3 and 4, you can really support by waiting on the red part of the playground rather than closer to the school so that the children can be handed over to you by the teachers safely.
